

Carpet Fishing!! Make your own indoor fishing game

You will need:

- Cardboard containers to cut up
- scissors
- glue
- Felt pens, colour pencils or paint
- string
- Pea sticks, canes or twigs
- velcro with double sided backing
- a cork or similar heavy object

Cut 6 or more fish shapes out of cardboard you can use a template or

design your own. Size around 20cm long



Decorate your fish how ever you like on one side

you can use paint, colour pencils, felt tips or collage



Attach the loop side of the velcro to the decorated side of the fish once it is dry



With a marker pen add numbers to the underside of your fish

The numbers will be the score for the fisher person and the winner will be the person whose fish add up to the highest number.



For the fishing rod tie a piece of string to the end of your stick

Cut to a length of choice depending on your height and if the fisher people are going to be sitting or standing to go fishing For the bait tie the other end of the string to a cork and attach the hook side of the velcro to one end of the cork Now you are ready to go fishing!





Notes

- This activity was intended as a way to bring school children and the older generation together with memories of fishing as children
 making your own rod and fishing in streams and of parents and grandparents fishing trips
- Talking about varieties of fish whilst decorating them
- As an extra activity you could make "Flies" using wire, wool and feathers to add to the rod

 If you try this at home do post photos and films of the end results and you and your families or residents carpet fishing in the living room!!



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
